5. Answer a worksheet with the help of the book.

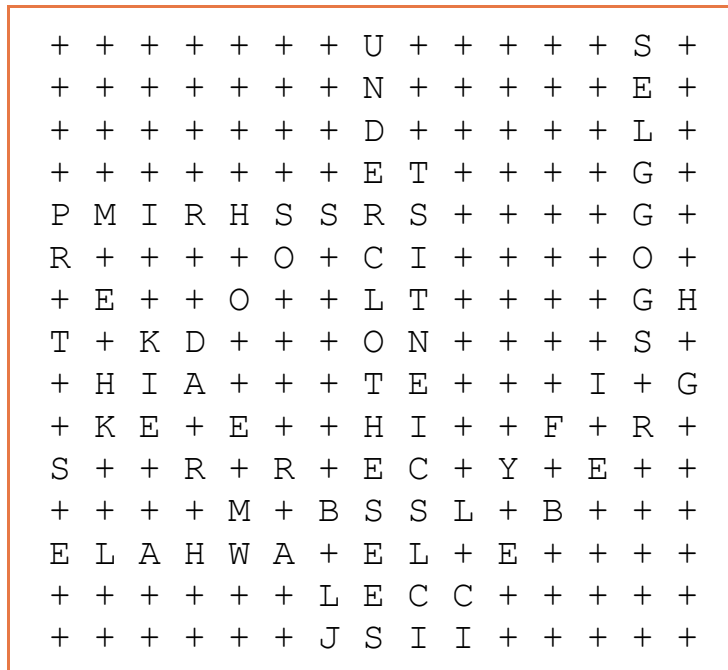
